2022 Watershed **Report Cards Released**

We celebrated World Water Day (March 22nd) with the release of the 2022 Watershed Report Cards of our local creeks. Each year over 20 volunteer stream monitors collect water quality data from over 24 sites in Mills Creek, Pipe Creek, and Old Woman Creek watersheds to help tell the public a story of their health. In 2022, the watershed program added Chappel Creek to the monitored watersheds and will begin reporting in the following year. The report cards help to make sense of our data by summarizing it into letter grades which most of us have become accustomed to.

After 10 years of reporting, the Old Woman Creek finally received a B! This in part is due to a small change in the scoring process but is also a sign that improvements in the watershed are making a difference.
